It may seem like a typical teenager's bedroom, but what you find may shock you. This interactive experience will challenge adults to identify over 60 seemingly ordinary items that could indicate youth drug/alcohol use, or other risky behaviors.

Hidden in Plain Sight is an interactive presentation for adults only.

Through a mock teenager's bedroom set up at your event or organization, participants will:

- Search the staged bedroom for clues that might indicate drug/alcohol use, or other risky behaviors
- Find out how ordinary items can be indicators of drug/alcohol use
- Learn about current drug and alcohol trends and how to recognize signs of abuse
- Learn how to talk to kids and youth about drugs/alcohol and other risky behaviors
- Receive information about community prevention and intervention resources
